

# Mrs. Helmstadter's Young Five Supplies

We are asking that you send in the following supplies to be kept and used as needed during the year. Please read carefully and only write your child's name on the rest supplies and 3 ring binder.

- 2 inch 3 ring binder with a clear plastic pocket on the outside covers  
(Please write name on inside cover.)
- 4 boxes of 8 small crayons (Preferably Crayola)
- 1 highlighter
- Two **sharpened** #2 pencils
- One regular sized bottle of white glue
- Sturdy two-pocket plastic folder with 3 prongs, to be kept in our backpacks
- 2 sets of headphones labeled with your child's name
- One container of sanitizing wipes
- Girls only- 1 box of Crayola fine line (skinny) markers and 1 roll of paper towels.
- Boys only- 1 box of Crayola broad line (fat) markers and 2 boxes of tissues.
- For rest time, your child will need a vinyl tri-fold nap mat. We need them to be vinyl so they can be disinfected often. You can usually find these at Walmart, Target, or Amazon. Here is a link so you can see a picture of what we are asking for <https://www.walmart.com/ip/Peerless-Plastics-Blue-Teal-KinderMat-2-x-19-x-44/50184165>. They are often called a "kindermat" and cost between \$10.00-\$20.00. The size that works for our lockers is the 19" wide, 1-2" thick and 44-45" long. Be aware that rest mats are a popular purchase this time of year, so I strongly encourage you to shop early. Please label the mat (not the tag) with a dark colored permanent marker.
- You may also want to provide a **very small** travel size pillow and **small** blanket. A beach towel works perfect for a little blanket. **Please label all the rest time supplies with your child's name. All our rest supplies must be stored in our lockers so please remember small is best.**
- Labeled gallon zip lock bag with a change of clothes - spills and accidents sometimes happen. This will be kept in your child's locker or backpack.
- A regular sized backpack

The children do **not** need pencil boxes; we will be sharing our supplies.
